CHAIR'S MESSAGE

Superintendent Lauren Callaway.

Since my last Chair's message there have been a number of key events that I wish to reflect on and which continue to reinforce to me the importance of Victoria Police Legacy.

On the 19th of July, our Patron Chief Commissioner, Graham Ashton, dedicated the wonderful Victoria Police Legacy building in the name of former Chief Commissioner, Mick Miller.

We were so lucky to have had three of the people who played such an integral role, in creating Victoria Police Legacy nearly 38 years ago, present at the dedication.

Joining Mr Miller was our inaugural President and Life Member, Bryan Kelly, and Peter Ryan, who was to follow Bryan as President. Bryan's attendance was a feat of resilience as he was extremely unwell and

told all his doctors he would be coming to this event regardless of their advice!

It was the Board's view, when deciding who the building would be named after, that there simply was no other individual other than Mr Miller who embodies the spirit of VPL, and who continues to remain so highly regarded in the hearts of our membership.

On the day of the building dedication I was privileged to launch our first strategic plan. It is the result of a collective effort by the Board, Staff and Police Legatees and I thank everyone for their input into the plan.

It provides the roadmap for how we will provide enduring support and deep effective ties to Victoria Police for our Police Legatees. The plan articulates our strategic priorities as:

- **Personalised and meaningful legatee support**
- **Growing our impact**
- **Being a recognised, trusted and proactive partner, and**
- **Being a sustainable, high performing organisation**

They sound very noble, appropriate priorities to have. But I was thinking, where do they come from and what do they actually mean?

When I was launching the plan, we had just returned from our children's camp where we took 30 kids away for four days. Some of these kids have lost a parent through suicide, and in particular there were several children who were some of the most traumatised children we have seen in the past few years.



Their interaction with other children was non-existent at the start of the camp and it caused Board Member, Kate O'Neill and I to start brainstorming about what we need to provide beyond a bi-annual event. We started thinking about what a 'Big Brother' 'Big Sister' program would look like to bridge the gap between critical front-end help and our social program.

Essentially, we are thinking about what type of extra support can help kids put behind them the trauma of the loss of a parent, even if it's just for small periods of time, and what will give them the best chance to grow into productive young people.

So, I look at the strategic plan and it confirms to me that yes, we do need to give personalised service to our Police Legatees, yes, we need to grow our impact beyond children's camps, and if we need to take that 'Big Brother', 'Big Sister' concept forward then we will need to partner with others to deliver a quality service.

Finally, September is a key month for VPL and in fact for all Police Legacies across the country, this being the month where we remember those who are no longer with us and which concludes with National Police Remembrance Day.

One of the key events that occurs during the month is the 'National Wall to Wall Remembrance Ride' to Canberra, which is now in its eighth year. At the start of this year's ride I was afforded the opportunity to say the following few words as a way of saying thanks as Chair, but more importantly, on behalf of Police Legatees:

"Victoria Police Legacy is extremely honoured to be part of this event which epitomises the strength of policing bonds

and the bringing together of values we hold dear in friendship, serving the community and looking after each other.


We are also extremely grateful for the financial support our membership provides in order to support police families.

Not simply content with providing our baseline support, everyone here has made a commitment to help grow the Wall to Wall Ride into one of our most significant commemorative, fundraising, and dare I say it, social events of the year. So, thank you all for that.

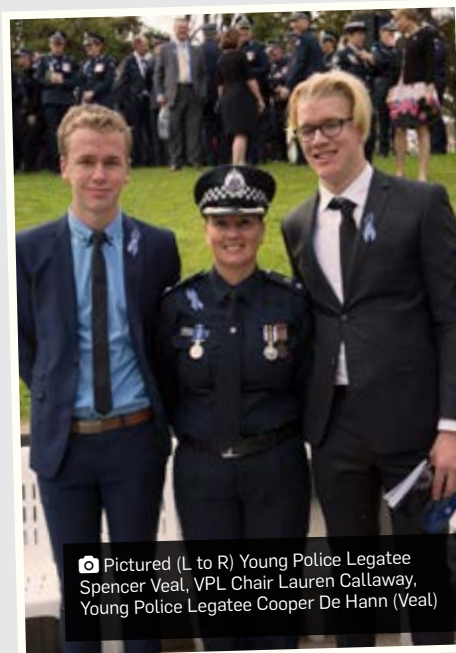
Gratitude is contextual and whilst we are extremely happy to know that this year's baton does not contain the name of a member killed on duty – we also pay our respects to the four families of members who have died in the past two weeks. Both the prevalence of those messages coming through this week, but also the individual circumstances of each death remind us of the fragility of life and the importance of family.


At the start of every Victoria Police Board Meeting we pay our respects to those in the policing family who have died – so in the past 12 months this has been the case for 102 people.

Whilst not every situation results in the beginning of support from VPL, our numbers continue to steadily grow and we are in the process of registering over 1000 legatees receiving support. This includes 32 children under the age of 10, and 165 children and young adults under the age of 22.


Our ability to help those families comes directly from our membership, so on behalf of the Board, and our dedicated staff, I thank you for including us today and for remaining supportive of our work throughout the course of your police careers. Safe travels to everyone."

A MILESTONE FOR VICTORIA POLICE LEGACY



The dedication of the 'S.I. (Mick) Miller Victoria Police Legacy Building'.

Another milestone was achieved by Victoria Police Legacy (VPL) on the 19th of July with the VPL offices in Carlton being dedicated as the 'S.I. (Mick) Miller Victoria Police Legacy Building' by VPL Patron Chief Commissioner, Graham Ashton AM.

It was an honour on the day for VPL to have present at the dedication former Chief Commissioner, Mick Miller, and two key founding members of VPL, retired Superintendent Peter Ryan and retired Inspector Bryan Kelly, along with other distinguished guests.

For many years since being established in 1980, VPL was accommodated in premises

belonging to 'The Police Association' (TPA) and the 'Police Credit Co-Op' (now Bank Vic). In 2014, VPL purchased and moved into the 'purpose acquired' premises at 'Louisa Terrace', 71 Drummond Street, Carlton. The idea of purchasing the building was to establish a separate identity from Victoria Police and as an important investment for the organisation, in that it saved on commercial rent and in the longer term should result in a capital gain for VPL.

In August 2016, the VPL Board determined that in honour of the role played in 1980 by the then and now former Chief Commissioner Mr. S.I. (Mick) Miller AO, LVO, C St. J, QPM in establishing Victoria Police Legacy, that the building be named the 'S.I. (Mick) Miller Victoria Police Legacy Building'. 🌟

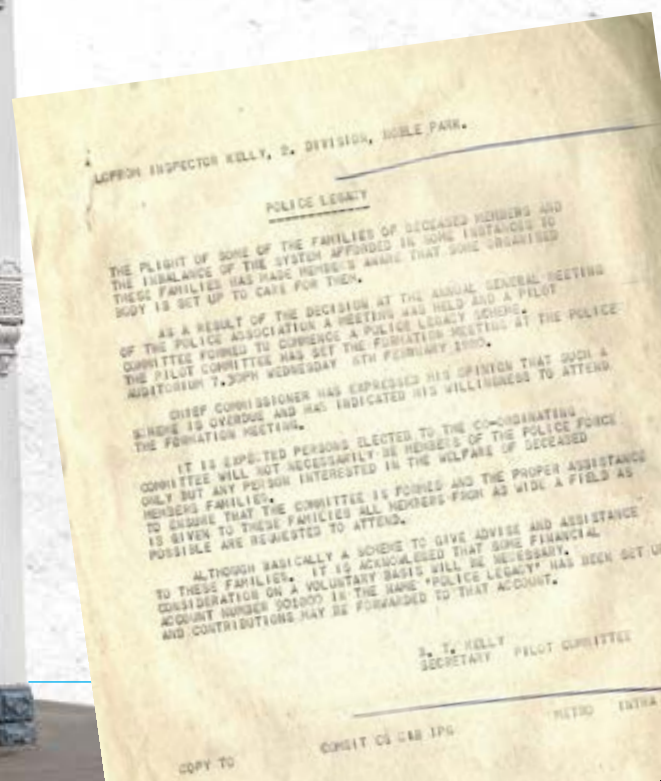

AN EXCERPT FROM: 'A SHORT HISTORY OF THE VICTORIA POLICE LEGACY SCHEME INCORPORATED MARCH 2015 - NOVEMBER 2015.'

The tragic murder of Detective Senior Constable Robert John Lane of Swan Hill CIB on 13th July 1979 contributed significantly to the establishment of VPL.

The Victoria Police 'Lane Appeal' was started to support Detective Lane's widow and children and attracted donations from all policing organisations in Australia as well as from members of the general public and private enterprise.

The appeal subsequently raised over \$100,000. At the very least the death of Detective Lane heightened the need for a robust system to be put in place to support police members and their families.

Chief Commissioner (Mick) Miller said: "The death of Bob Lane brings home to every member, the hazards and the reality of police work. We all identify with Bob Lane because what happened to him could have happened to any one of us".

As a result of the meritorious efforts of then Superintendent Peter

Ryan and Inspector Bryan Kelly, VPL was formally established and commenced operation on 6th February 1980.

Both Ryan and Kelly had a deep commitment in the late 1970's to developing "welfare" schemes for existing police members such as the Police Credit Cooperative.

In the course of carrying out this work they identified a void in the level of "welfare available to widows, widowers, and their families".

In a submission to TPA concerning the need for such a Scheme in Victoria Police, Kelly said; "If we are in doubt as to whether there is such a need in Victoria, I would ask you to think back about the families of deceased members. What do we know about them? Are we even aware that the Association remembers them at Christmas?"

While Ryan and Kelly were travelling on business in Queensland they were shown the workings of the Queensland Police Legacy Scheme (QPLS). This impressed them and subsequently led to the implementation of a similar system in Victoria.

As a result of their visit they approached the Chief Commissioner (Mick) Miller and Deputy Commissioner Salisbury and received full support with regard to introducing a similar scheme in Victoria. Support for VPL was also obtained from TPA. Ryan said; "One stipulation Mr. Miller made was that VPL should be wholly funded within the police organisation".

During all the activities on the day the SOG members were supportive and encouraging, guiding each young police legatee through the challenges.

Victoria Police Legacy enters a new era with a new 'Constitution'

The 20th September saw Victoria Police Legacy enter a new era following months of work by the Board with the adoption of a new "Constitution" at a Special General Meeting of members. The 'Constitution' continues the journey of enhancing the governance arrangements and is in line with *Strategic Priority No. 4 – A Sustainable and High Performing Organisation*, of the recently launched 'Victoria Police Legacy Strategic Plan 2017-2021'. Highlights of the new 'Constitution' include:

- Provision for former members, who have served at least 25 years prior to retirement or resignation, to become members of the association.
- Enhancing the Object and Powers of the association for relief of grief and hardship experienced to members, their partners and families and VPL Legatees, caused by imminent or actual death or

permanent (prolonged) disability and for other related purposes.

- Formally establishing the position of 'Ambassador' of the association.
- The inclusion of the definition, 'Volunteer'.
- Amendment to the 'Board composition' from eight to seven elected Directors, removal of the Board executive position of Treasurer (to be replaced by an employed Finance position) and the ability for the appointment of Director, (at the discretion of the Board), who may not be a member of the association who possesses a mix of skills and attributes, which is required from time to time.
- Maximum three-year period of appointment of office bearer's, with an option for one further year.
- Amending the time of appointment of elected Directors from one to two years.
- The inclusion of the ability for the receipt of proxy votes from Members at General Meetings.
